

FROM THE PRESIDENT



Since the last newsletter what turned out to be a bumper winter has sadly (for some) come to an end and summer is not far off with its own pleasures. In the Snowy's these are many and various – the emergence of the alpine wild flowers are always something special, fishing becomes more productive for those


with the knack (I don't!) and cycling on and off road is a pleasure for many.

For RASCAL our post winter

working bee on the weekend of 9 October was a success with a strong turn-up of members and guests ticking off a number of scheduled and ad hoc tasks. Thanks to all who attended. If you missed or weren't able to make the October working bee, put March 3 in your schedule for 2018 – that is the date of the next working bee.

The other major activity, for the committee at least, was the annual all day committee meeting at the

Lodge in early October. Major items of business for this meeting include setting the fees for the coming



year, by-law changes, approval of our standing contracts and some robust discussion of the lodge refurbishment program. Touching on the meeting outcomes briefly:

Fees: The committee chose to maintain most fee increases to be roughly in line with inflation with a couple of minor exceptions. Midweek block booking rates have been lifted, joining fees remain unchanged and room 2 rates were lifted a little more to reflect the extra utility of the room. While the Committee is aware of members desire for the Club to be "affordable" we must also acknowledge the need for the club to remain solvent and this is a consideration each year when we



set our fees. This means that the club's financial positions is and will remain healthy.

Membership renewals: These will now open on 1 December, a month later than previous years. This takes some pressure off the

committee and offers the opportunity to free-up the lodge a little in October when there is still the chance of snow.

By-law changes: Unlike last year we made no major changes to our by-laws with the following being the only changes:

- a. Members and quests will be allocated only one carpark per room booked. During busy times the carpark's capacity is often exceeded by the number of cars members and guests bring, often because people may have to arrive and or depart at different times. This is understandable, but should not disadvantage other lodge users. So if the number of cars needed for your party exceeds the number of rooms in your booking, then you will be required to park the excess car(s) on the street.
- b. In an effort to be more family friendly we are not scheduling block bookings during the spring & autumn ACT & NSW school holiday periods.

Refurbishments: The Committee agreed to continue with the program of lodge upgrades and is currently preparing a schedule that will focus on the bedrooms and possibly some of the wet areas and top floor living area. We are in the process of preparing a limited survey to members who have used

the refurbished rooms in order to seek constructive feedback. Watch out for this in your inbox.



Refurbishments approved and un-

derway are:

- a. Scheduled for early December is the expansion and concreting of the carpark, that will see parking capacity increase by two and the surface sealed completely (no gravel!). Thanks to Peter Dunnet for driving (sorry) this.
- b. Also, thanks to Peter, we are arranging to have the Kitchen cupboard doors and draw fronts resurfaced. The original plastic wrap covering is coming off and while unsightly is also a cuts and slices hazard.

Annual Photo competition: The committee enthusiastically supported Alan Laird's proposal to run an annual photographic competition for members. Communication has been sent out via email to our members, further details can be

found on page 7 of this news-letter and also on our website.

Don't forget

the competition it is open to both Rascal members and any of their guest who have stayed at the Lodge in 2017!

The above is a summary of what was and always is a busy day for the Committee who all give their time to ensure the club is run smoothly and efficiently for you, its members. I thank them all for their contributions on behalf of all members.



I would generally like to contribute to the functioning of the lodge which has given me some wonderful memories.


Did you know that.....

20 years after Carl David Anderson and Seth Neddermeyer discovered that muons were

generated from cosmic rays in 1936, the Australian physicist Eric Paul George made the first known attempt to measure the areal density of the rock overburden of the Guthega-Munyang tunnel (part of the Snowy Mountains Hydro-Electric Scheme) with cosmic ray muons.

He used a Geiger counter. Although he succeeded in measuring the areal density of rock overburden placed above the detector, and even successfully matched the result from core samples, due to the lack of directional sensitivity in the Geiger counter, imaging was impossible.
